

How To Organize A Hoody Drive

- 1. Gather of group of people to help you. Set up a committee of volunteers (ie: friends/colleagues)
- 2. Determine the time frame of your Hoody Drive. Drives should be completed by October 13th.
- 3. Determine how long the drive will last—a few days, a week, a month?
- 4. Promote the hoody drive via email, social media, posters or other means. Use United Way's online toolkit for creative tools, suggested content and more by visiting bit.ly/HoodiesToolkit
- 5. Set up a drive collection area—a common area in your workplace or an employee's office space.
- 6. Deliver the new hoodies to United Way's offices at 1250 Penn Avenue.
- 7. Share photos and success stories of your drive on social media. Tag @unitedwayswpa and use #HoodiesForTheHolidays

Supplies Needed For Your Drive

- Table and chairs
- Boxes or bins for collecting hoodies
- Name tags for volunteers

- Promotional materials (go to bit.ly/HoodiesToolkit for help)
- Poster or signage
