
# Leading the way for COVID-19 response.

When the state of Pennsylvania issued a shelter-in-place order during the first days of the crisis, United Way's network was already in place, doing what we've always done — convening corporate and donor resources and making sure that basic human needs were being met. Corporations, philanthropists and individual donors knew instinctively that United Way was uniquely prepared to marshal the response. As a result of their generosity, we were able to coordinate critical-relief efforts to make sure people had food on the table and could safely shelter while officials managed the health crisis.

# The economic impact continues to grow and widen.

Thousands of families and individuals who never before thought of themselves as needing assistance desperately did. Small business owners have had to close, furloughing workers many of whom were living just above the poverty level as it was. And families who were already struggling financially before have been hurt even worse. As jobs and wages disappear or become more unstable, their personal spiral of crisis only steepens. Just consider that since the start of the pandemic:

- The unemployment rate in Southwestern Pennsylvania more than quadrupled in May compared to last year.
- People already living below the poverty line are facing additional food insecurity due to loss of wages and school closings.
- Seniors and those with underlying health conditions are more isolated than ever as they fear for their health.
- Experts are expecting a wave of evictions once emergency housing measures expire.
- An unprecedented number of new families and individuals have requested assistance for the very first time.

#### 1. United Way's Impact Fund

challenges aren't new, but the scale has never been greater. Together, we can make real progress in helping struggling families regain their financial footing — even in these uncertain times.

#### 3. The Emergency Basic Needs Fund (EBNF)



United Way's Emergency Basic Need Fund provides direct, short-term assistance for people facing an immediate threat such as utility cut-offs, eviction or hunger. During the COVID-19 Crisis, the need for the fund continued to grow as did the network of agencies who are able to provide services with generous donations from donors like you. The fund provides grants up to \$700 for individuals to help them get through the immediate crisis and get back on a path to self-sufficiency. The EBNF will continue to play a crucial role going forward during the long recovery period ahead.
